



NETWORK Q RALLY OF GREAT BRITAIN TICKETS GO ON SALE

**Spectator safety - combined with breath-taking views - the
priorities**

14th - 17th November 2002

Addressing - and going beyond - the FIA ruling on spectator safety at motor rally events, the organisers of the Network Q Rally of Great Britain have announced the ticket plans for this year's event. In a revolutionary approach to rally ticketing - but one that will be familiar to other spectator events - ticketing for the 2002 Rally will be strictly allocated for each stage and car park of the event. The aim is to provide spectators with the ultimate in safe spectating, at the same time eliminating the risk of stages having to be cancelled due to over-crowding or other safety concerns.

"Creating a positive spectator experience, combined with excellent spectator safety, is at the heart of the new ticketing strategy for 2002", confirmed Ian Parry, Promotions Director. "This year's Network Q Rally will see some of the best spectator points ever on a rally - all within the bounds of the FIA's ruling on spectator safety. This has been achieved by strictly designating ticketing for each stage, with some stages being only accessible through advance purchase tickets and others restricted to ticket purchases on the day."

The new ticket strategy is designed to ensure that every spectator who purchases a ticket in advance can be 100% certain that they will be able to get into their chosen stages - and without any problems with parking. Through close liaison with the Forest Enterprise, the local organisations who run the car parks, as well as the emergency services in Mid, South and West Wales, the safe capacity for each stage has been determined, including car parks and the route into each stage. The result is that the number of tickets sold for each stage will be strictly limited to match that safe capacity.

"It has never been more important to book in advance to guarantee your place on the rally", continued Parry.

"There will be a variety of tickets available for advance purchase - two types of 3 day Event Passes, Day Passes for each day of the Rally and even individual access to two areas - the Cardiff SuperSpecial and a new, purpose-built spectating area in Rheola Forest - the Walter's Arena."

Walter's Arena is an all-new addition to Stages 6 (Friday 14th) and 15 (Sunday 17th) where an extra mile of unsealed road has been added to test the drivers and thrill the crowds. **This is the only single Forest Stage access pass available in advance for Friday and Sunday - easily accessible and with plenty of parking,** it will be a great place for the family to watch World Championship rallying at its best.

For Rally newcomers, the SuperSpecials in Cardiff Bay on Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening provide the ideal introduction to this exhilarating sport, with Grandstand and spectator banking tickets available. And for the truly dedicated Rally enthusiasts, Thursday's Day Pass includes access to the Shakedown as well as the opening SuperSpecial in Cardiff. Tickets for the Service Park at Felindre, Wales, near Swansea, can be purchased on the day, or in advance with any one of the Day Passes.

"Our aim is to give spectators the absolute certainty that they will be able to get into the stages without any problems of access or parking and their safety will be paramount", confirmed Ian Parry. "This new approach to ticketing gives us the ability to provide that assurance for advance ticket holders. It also means that, for spectators who want to buy tickets on the day, we will be able to accurately promote availability so that people are not queuing unnecessarily."

Tickets can be purchased by ringing the ticket hotline on 0870 1212529 or going online at www.networkq.co.uk. If a spectator orders a single pass, it will attract a £10 single person supplement. Child passes are available for children aged 9-15. All prices include VAT.
